

**University Credit for National School Foundation Association
Conference
March 27-April 21, 2017**

Professionals engaged in and leading school foundations desire and seek opportunities for growth and development to better perform the work they do and expand their foundations' efforts. Receiving university graduate credit for professional development is important to a number of those who are involved in ongoing professional learning. To meet their needs, the National School Foundation Association offers those attending the National Conference, graduate credit through the University of Northern Iowa.

One hour of graduate credit will be awarded for attending at least five breakout sessions and two keynote addresses at the National Conference each year. Along with attending required learning sessions, those seeking graduate credit will write a reflection paper after the conference noting what they learned at the conference and through networking during the conference and how they will apply learning in their local setting. The reflection paper will be double-spaced, no more than six pages and no less than three pages in length.

In addition, a second hour of credit can be obtained each year by attending an NSFA regional meeting, state affiliate meeting or at least two webinars. In each case, a reflection paper citing what was learned and how it can be applied in the participant's local setting is required. To receive graduate credit for regional meetings, state affiliate meetings and webinars, those seeking the second hour of graduate credit must have attended NSFA's National Conference in the year in which they are asking for graduate credit.
